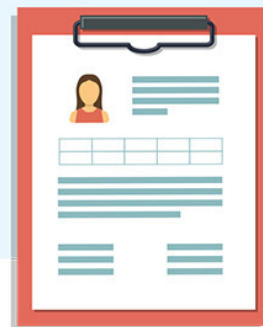


TALKING WITH YOUR DOCTOR
